### **Pupil Premium : Family Learning Project**

#### **Rationale:**

Lack of engagement by some parents along with their perceived low importance of educational outcomes has a detrimental impact on the progress and attainment of our PP learners. It is hoped that through increased parental engagement and the opportunity to access wide learning experience learners will make accelerated progress.

#### **What is the Family Learning Project?**

A creative approach to engaging families in their child's learning; which empowers parents and increases their confidence in their ability to contribute to their children's education. An opportunity to: participate in innovative and enjoyable activities together; develop new skills and increase their understanding of learning outdoors.

#### **Project:**

- 6 weekly afternoon sessions (1:15 – 3:00)
- Delivered by a member of Redbrook Hayes staff
- Resources will be provided
- Childcare funded (if appropriate)
- Feedback will be requested at the start and end of each individual project
- A range of activities will be delivered

#### **Impact:**

- Projects will lead to enhanced home-school links which will improve outcomes for all Pupil Premium learners – evidence attendance for PP learners will improve; reading engagement will increase and more parents will attend learning sessions.
- Through projects aimed primarily at fathers, opportunities will open up for men to become more involved in their child's learning journey – evidence parental feedback
- Created more opportunities for parents' own skills and knowledge to be recognised and utilised – increased amount of parents in school
- Increase parents' confidence in their ability to contribute to their children's education – evidence collated from parental feedback
- Increased links with the community – evidence community involvement
- Promoted health and wellbeing through healthy eating projects; physical activities – link to attendance.
